Dear Administrator Wright,

I understand that the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) is in the process of weighing proposals which would change the way it distributes power from federal dams on the Columbia and Snake rivers. Clearly, such decisions will have profound impacts on salmon and salmon dependent communities.

Up until now, the BPA and other federal agencies have largely failed to meet their legal salmon recovery responsibilities. Now is the time to redeem this poor record with the public. As a concerned citizen, I urge the BPA to ensure that any plans to change its power supply role include measures to improve the conditions facing wild salmon and increase investments in clean, renewable energy.
